PRINCIPAL'S NEWS

English Language Classes in 2020 for our School Community

We have formed a partnership with St George TAFE and we will be able to offer parents, carers and family members a TAFE level English language course next year. It would run all year and would be for 3hrs every week.

The learning is planned around the needs of the students and would be very practical. There would be a screening assessment to work out the level of English proficiency for our adult learners. If you would like to participate - please see myself or the office. This is great for our school community.

Excessive Clothing

Many students are wearing too much clothing in the hot weather. Heat stress can occur and students can have a higher risk of overheating and heat stroke. Often students cannot detect signs or symptoms of overheating and teachers do need to step in for the health and safety of students.

We understand some families may wish their child/ren to dress conservatively for religious reasons - which is fine. But wearing tracksuit pants and jumpers are not appropriate in this hot weather.

In some cases students may be asked to remove excessive clothing for their own health and safety. If we are having difficulties with students who do not understand the potential risks from overdressing, parents and carers will be called to discuss this or be asked to come for a meeting. The safety and wellbeing of our students is our key concern.

Dental visits

These are happening this week. You will get a report on your child's assessment and if further dental treatment is needed, this can also be planned for the free clinic at Hurstville. Thanks

to the parents and carers for the positive feedback about this program.

Swimming Scheme

This will take place in Weeks 7 and 8. There will be a meeting later in the week about this with the students to remind them about what is required over the 2 weeks. Happy swimming!
